

Sleep Medicine (Polysomnographic) Technology

Dear Prospective Student:

Thank you for your interest in acquiring an associates degree or certificate in Sleep Medicine (Polysomnographic) Technology at GateWay Community College. Sleep Technologists (also known as polysomnographic technologists) conduct sleep studies and work under the supervision of physicians to provide evaluation and treatment of sleep disorders in a variety of patient care settings, which include private sleep centers and hospital sleep centers.

There are an estimated 50-70 million people in the US suffering from a chronic sleep disorder, many of which are undiagnosed or untreated. Due to the extensive growth in the field of Sleep Medicine there is a local and national demand for credentialed sleep technologists.

The Gateway Sleep Medicine Technology Program provides the student with the clinical skills and fundamental knowledge to effectively monitor, analyze and treat different sleep disorders.

The program is fully accredited and is 17 months long. The Sleep Medicine Technology Program offers two options of either an Associates degree or a certificate. Details about each pathway are provided in this information packet.

We begin new classes every fall and accept a maximum of 20 students. Prior to submitting your application into the Sleep Medicine Technology Program, prerequisite coursework is required. Specific detailed information related to program admission and operations can be found in this packet.

CAREER DESCRIPTION

Sleep Medicine is the diagnosis and treatment of sleep disorders and other sleep related problems.

As a Registered or Certified Sleep Technologist you will perform sleep studies/tests on patients of all age groups. Sleep technologists monitor, evaluate and identify different sleep disorders eg. Sleep Apnea, Narcolepsy, REM Behavior Disorder and they apply therapy if it is indicated. They are also involved in educating patients about their sleep study and therapy. Employment for a Sleep Technologist involves working in a variety of care settings, including private sleep clinics and hospital based sleep clinics. Sleep Technologists are healthcare professionals that make a difference in patients' lives.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS - SLEEP MEDICINE (PSG) TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR THE SLEEP MEDICINE (PSG) TECHNOLOGY AAS DEGREE

- 1. Formal application can be made at any time.
- 2. Formal admission to the program is required.
- 3. Background Check Requirements: Admission to an Allied Health program requires that students be in compliance with the Maricopa County Community College District Background Check standards. Upon conditional program enrollment, the student must comply with all requirements of the MCCCD background check policy.

- Currently registered or registry eligible Electroneurodiagnostic Technologist (END/EEG) or a graduate of a Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Educational Programs (CAAHEP) accredited END/EEG program.

- According to Arizona Revised Statute, 15-1802 F, "A person who is a member of an Indian tribe

Students must also plan on the expense of driving to clinical locations across the metropolitan Phoenix and outlying areas. Several clinical affiliates are not on bus routes so one's own private transportation vehicle is necessary.

The health and safety requirements are subject to change based on the requirements of our clinical partners.

DRUG SCREENING

All allied health students are required to submit to a random pre-clinical urine drug screen according to policy of the specific Allied Health Program. The cost for tests will be the responsibility of the student. The urine drug screen will test for alcoholic beverages; illegal drugs, or drugs that may impair judgment while in the clinical agency. If the drug test is positive for the illegal drugs or undocumented prescription drugs, the student will not be able to continue in the program. MCCCD policy regarding medical marijuana:

"Medical marijuana, or its metabolite, is not an accepted substance in urine drug screens and will result in a positive urine drug screen. Students with a prescription for medical marijuana would not be considered exempt from urine drug screening". Readmission is at the discretion of the college and the program.

Some clinical sites also require screening for nicotine. Students who test positive for nicotine are allowed to continue in the program, but may be limited to clinical agencies that do not test for nicotine.

MCCCD BACKGROUND CHECK POLICY REQUIREMENTS

Students seeking admission to an MCCCD Allied Health or Nursing Program (Program) will be required to obtain a valid Level-One Arizona Department of Public Safety Fingerprint Clearance Card (FCC Card) AND a passing score on an MCCCD background check. This policy precludes MCCCD faculty or staff from assigning students to a clinical experience who cannot meet the new requirements.

Upon admission to the program, students are required to present a copy of the DPS card and apply for the MCCCD Background Check. Students bear the financial costs for both the MCCCD Background Check and the AZ Fingerprint Clearance Card. Students will receive Information regarding the MCCCD Background Check after admission, but prior to the beginning of the program.

We encourage students to apply for the card early in the application process. Please allow a minimum of eight weeks processing time for the DPS Level-One Fingerprint Clearance card. The card is valid for six years from the date of issue.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What type of people make the best Sleep Medicine (PSG) Technologists?

PSG Technologists are people who:

- ✓ Enjoy providing patient care
- ✓ Enjoy working with high-tech equipment
- ✓ Can think on their feet
- ✓ Work well as part of a team
- ✓ Can adapt to a dynamic and changing work environment
- ✓ Can adapt well to working variable shifts, including day, evening and night shifts

What are the essential functions of a PSG Technologist?

- ✓ Demonstrate visual acuity and auditory ability to assess the condition of a patient and administer effective patient care.
- ✓ Demonstrate manual dexterity, eye-hand coordination, fine and gross motor skills, and tactile abilities to perform functions as a PSG Technologist.
- ✓ Demonstrate critical thinking and problem-solving skill for effective patient management and implementation of selected treatment interventions.
- ✓ Maneuver equipment in a patient's room or in the sleep disorders center.
- ✓ Work in stressful situations that require quick thinking and the simultaneous coordination of a variety of activities.
- ✓ Demonstrate physical agility to respond to patient and family needs, including unexpected changes in the patient's status.
- ✓ Demonstrate the physical ability to assist patients in ambulating, positioning in bed, and transferring to and from chair, wheelchair, bed or gurney.
- ✓ Demonstrate proper body mechanics for lifting.
- ✓ Lift objects in excess of 50 pounds with assistance, with frequent lifting and/or carrying objects weighing 50 pounds or more.
- ✓ Tolerate prolonged standing, stooping, squatting, bending, pushing, and pulling.
- ✓ Demonstrate ability to read, write, understand and speak English.
- ✓ Demonstrate effective verbal and non-verbal communication skills with internal and external customers.

Students who are unable to perform these functions, with or without reasonable accommodations, may be unsafe in the clinical environment and thus may likely be unsuccessful in the program.

What happens when I am accepted into the Program?

All applicants accepted into the Program will be notified through Maricopa student email only. Information regarding registration and an orientation session will be sent to the admitted applicants along with the admittance email.

Admitted applicants must return the formal email notification indicating their intent to attend the program. IF THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT IS NOT RETURNED BY THE DATE SPECIFIED, THE APPLICANT'S POSITION IN THE PROGRAM WILL BE FORFEITED.

Can I continue in the program if I am pregnant or become pregnant?

The student has the option of remaining in the Program and continuing her education without notification or interruption. This decision should be made in consultation with her physician. If the student chooses to take a leave of absence from the Program during the pregnancy, she will be allowed to re-enter the Program once the period of convalescence is complete. Based upon the length of absence from training, the student may be required to recertify in specific clinical competencies prior to graduation. Placement into the original clinical site is not guaranteed, but another training site will be provided for the student. The student must complete all Program and institutional graduation requirements prior to graduation as outlined in the college catalog. For more details see Program policies:

What credentials are available for a Sleep Medicine (Polysomnographic) Technologist?

Graduates of an accredited Associates Degree program in Sleep Medicine (Polysomnographic)Technology are eligible to sit for the BRPT (Board of Registered Polysomnographic Technologists) exam. The BRPT credentialing program is accredited by the National Commission of Certifying Agencies (NCCA). The BRPT also offers the Advanced Certification in Clinical Sleep Health Exam and the Pediatric Sleep certificate exam. Registered or Certified Respiratory therapists are eligible to take the Sleep Disorders Speciality exam given by the Nation Board for Respiratory C (NBRC). Can I apply previously earned college credits to this program of study?

Previously earned college credits in Sleep Medicine (Polysomnographic) Technology may be acceptable toward certificate requirements; however, transcripts must be evaluated for equivalency with the Sleep Medicine (PSG) Technology Program.

Can I get financial aid or a scholarship?

Financial assistance is available to eligible GateWay Community College students in the form of grants, scholarships, employment or loans. Students may receive assistance from only one funding source, or aid may be offered in a package from multiple sources. This depends on student eligibility, level of need, packaging policy, and availability of funds. Additional information is available from the Office of Financial Aid Services; call (602)286-8300.

What opportunities exist for career advancement after graduation?

With continued education and/or additional on-the-job training, the Sleep Medicine (Polysomnographic) Technologist can advance to diagnostic testing specialties such as research, education, durable medical equipment (DME) management and distribution, and sleep center management.

If I have a criminal record, will that prohibit me from being successful in this career? Possibly; our clinical agreements with the healthcare facilities require that our students receive a Fingerprint Clearance Card issued by the Arizona Department of Public Safety. Additionally, a student must not be listed on the federal government's Office of the Inspector General's Exclusion List. Students who are unable to obtain either of these clearances will be prohibited from attending their clinical experience.

What can I expect if I am accepted into the Program?

The curriculum is offered as a full-time evening program over a 9-month period. Generally, lecture, laboratory and clinical classes are held Monday through Friday between 12:00 noon and 11:00 p.m. on campus, and clinical site training from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. For students who work while attending the program, it is recommended that work hours be reduced due to the time required for study and class preparation. Student clinical rotations are designed to provide exposure to a variety of clinical experiences in the hospital and clinic setting. Students must provide their own transportation to clinical rotation sites. Students will be required to complete 8- to 12-hour clinical rotations twice a week beginning in the first semester of the Program.

POLICIES, RULES, REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS COMPLIANCE

Overview of the Requirements

In order for students to be admitted to or maintain enrollment in good standing in Maricopa County Community College District's ("MCCCD") Allied Health and Nursing programs ("Programs"), students must provide with their application to a Program all of the following:

- A copy of an Arizona Department of Public Safety Level-One Fingerprint Clearance Card ("Card"). Students are required to pay the cost of applying for the Card. Cards that are NOT Level-One status will not be accepted.
- An original version of the "Criminal Background Check Disclosure Acknowledgement" form attached to this Summary signed by the student.

At all times during enrollment in a Program, students must obtain and maintain BOTH a valid Level-One Fingerprint Clearance Card and passing disposition on supplemental background check performed by MCCCD authorized vendor. Admission requirements related to background checks are subject to change as mandated by clinical experience partners

Implementation of the Requirements

- 1. Students that are denied issuance of a Card may be eligible for a good cause exception through the Arizona Department of Public Safety. It is the student's responsibility to seek that exception directly with the department. Until the student obtains a Card and meets the other requirements for admission, he or she will not be admitted to a Program.
- Students admitted to a Program whose Card is revoked or suspended must notify the Program Director immediately and the student will be removed from the Program in which they have been admitted or are enrolled. Any refund of funds would be made per MCCCD policy.
- 3. The Criminal Background Check Disclosure Acknowledgement directs students to disclose on the data collection form of the MCCCD authorized background check vendor all of the requested information as well as any information that the background check may discover. Honesty is important as it demonstrates character. Lack of honesty will be the basis for denial of admission or removal from a Program if the information that should have been disclosed but was not would have resulted in denial of admission. Failure to disclose other types of information constitutes a violation of the Student Code of Conduct and may be subject to sanctions under that Code. Students have a duty to update the information requested on the [background check vendor] data collection form promptly during enrollment in a Program. The [background check vendor] data collection form may ask for the following information but the form may change from time to time:
 - Legal Name
 - Maiden Name
 - Other names used
 - Social Security Number
 - Date of Birth
 - Arrests, charges or convictions of any criminal offenses, even if dismissed or expunged, including dates and details.
 - Pending criminal charges that have been filed against you including dates and details.
 - Participation in a first offender, deferred adjudication or pretrial diversion or other probation program or arrangement where judgment or conviction has been withheld.

The authorized MCCCD background check vendor will be asked to pass or fail each student based on the standards of MCCCD's clinical experience partners that have established the most stringent requirements. The sole recourse of any student who fails the background check and believes that failure may have been in error is with the background check vendor and not MCCCD.

Summary of Criminal Background Check Requirement

All allied health and nursing students who seek to enroll in MCCCD healthcare programs must complete a Criminal Background Check. The outlined criteria have been created based on MCCCD's largest clinical experience hospital partners. These partners have stringent background check standards that preclude MCCCD from assigning students to their sites who cannot meet those standards. In order for MCCCD students to be able to continue to complete clinical experiences at local hospitals, students must meet these standards.

For persons wishing to enroll in a Program the person must meet the following standards:

- Possession of a valid Arizona Department of Public Safety Level One Fingerprint Clearance Card. Students who currently possess a DPS Card that is another level will not be allowed entrance into a health care program. Students are required to pay the cost of obtaining this background check. If the Level-One Fingerprint Clearance Card is revoked or suspended at any time during the admission process or while enrolled in a MCCCD healthcare program a student must notify the Program Director immediately and he or she will be removed from the Program. Please see the "Frequently Asked Questions" sheet for details regarding the DPS Card.
- Each student must provide documentation that he or she has completed and "passed" a MCCCD-supplemental background check through the approved vendor **American DataBank**. Students are required to pay the cost of obtaining this background check. Students whose background checks are more than six months old on the date of beginning a healthcare program must obtain an updated background check. Students who have been in a Program for more than 12 months may be requested to obtain an updated background check. Please see the attached "Frequently Asked Questions" sheet for more details regarding the MCCCD supplemental-background check.
- The MCCCD supplemental or the clinical agency background check may include but are not limited to the following:
 - Nationwide Federal Healthcare Fraud and Abuse Databases
 - Social Security Verification
 - Residency History
 - Arizona Statewide Criminal Records
 - Nationwide Criminal Database
 - Nationwide Sexual Offender Registry
 - Homeland Security Search
- By virtue of the MCCCD supplemental background check, students will be disqualified for admission to a
 program or continued enrollment in a program based on their criminal offenses, the inability to verify their
 Social Security number, or their being listed in an exclusionary database of a Federal Agency or on a sex
 offender registry. Offenses that will lead to a "fail" on the supplemental background check may include but are
 not limited to:
 - Social Security Search-Social Security number does not belong to applicant
 - o Any inclusion on any registered sex offender database
 - Any inclusion on any of the Federal exclusion lists or Homeland Security watch list
 - Any conviction of Felony no matter what the age of the conviction
 - Any warrant in any state

Any misdemeanor conviction for the following-No matter age of crime violent crimes burglary sex crime of any kind including non pandering consensual sexual crimes and sexual any crime against minors, children, vulnerable adults including abuse. murder, attempted murder neglect, exploitation abduction any abuse or neglect assault any fraud robbery illegal drugs arson aggravated DUI extortion Any misdemeanor controlled substance conviction last 7 years Any other misdemeanor convictions within last 3 years Exceptions: Any misdemeanor traffic (DUI is not considered Traffic) At all times students are in a program they must maintain BOTH a valid Level-One Fingerprint Clearance Card and passing disposition on the MCCCD supplemental background check performed by the MCCCDauthorized vendor. Admission requirements related to background checks are subject to change without notice. Some clinical agencies may require additional components of a criminal background check, other than those required by MCCCD, as well as a drug screening. Students are required to pay for any and all criminal background checks and drug screens required by a clinical agency to which they are assigned Even though a student possesses a valid DPS Level One Fingerprint Clearance Card and has passed the MCCCD supplemental background check, a clinical agency may decline to place a student due to information the clinical agency obtains in a background check it requires. If a clinical agency to which a student has been assigned does not accept the student based on his or her criminal background check, the student may not be able to complete the program. MCCCD may, within its discretion, disclose to a clinical agency that a student has been rejected by another clinical agency. MCCCD has no obligation to make attempts to place a student when the reasons for lack of placement are criminal background check issues. Since clinical agency assignments are critical requirements for completion of the program, inability to complete required clinical experience due to a student's criminal background check will result in removal from the program.
