The step above is very important for clock hour students. If you select Gateway instead, you delay the process to secure funding.

- Agency/Third-Party Funding
- Pay In Full (Buy-In)
- Payment Plan -Down payment is required to secure your seat, monthly payments are calculated and the student pays a set amount throughout their program. Total amount of the program will need to be paid before the student receives their certificate of completion.

Failure to secure funding for the program 30 days before the program start date will put students at risk of being dropped from courses due to non-payment
