

**GateWay Community College**  
**Physical Therapist Assistant Program**  
**Graduation Rate, Employment Rate, Pass Rate**

1. Graduation Rate

The cumulative graduation rate for students admitted to the Physical Therapist Assisting Program is listed below. The rate is based on students who completed all program requirements within 150% of the normal time to complete the program. Students that withdrew from the program due to personal reasons are not included in the graduation rate.

Day Program

Class of 2022= 88.89% (16/18)

Class of 2023= 83.33% (15/18)

**Two Year Average= 86.11% (31/36)**

Hybrid/Weekend Program

Class of 2022= 71.4% (10/14)

Class of 2023= 90.9% (10/11)

**Two-year average = 80% (20/25)**

2. Employment Rate

The employment rate for graduates of the Physical Therapist Assistant Program is listed below. The employment rate is based on graduates reporting working in either a full-time or part-time position as a physical therapist assistant nine months after graduation.

Day Program

Class of 2022= 100% (6 graduates responded)

Class of 2023 = 100% (2 graduates responded)

**Two-year average = 100%**

Hybrid/Weekend Program

Class of 2022= 100% (4 graduates responded)

Class of 2023= 100% (4 graduates responded)

**Two-year average = 100%**

3. \*Pass Rate for the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE) for Physical Therapist Assistants

To be licensed or certified as a physical therapist assistant many states, including Arizona, require that an individual pass the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE) for Physical Therapist Assistants. The pass rates (includes students who have required more than one attempt to pass the examination) for the PTA Program at GateWay Community College are as follows:

**Two Year Cumulative Average for 2021/2022 for the Day Program for the Ultimate Pass Rate = 93.55%**

**Two Year Cumulative Average for 2021/2022 for the Hybrid/Weekend Program for the Ultimate Pass Rate = 100%**
